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The main task of the joint technical committee is to prepare International Standards. Draft International Standards adopted by the joint technical committee are circulated to national bodies for voting. Publication as an International Standard requires approval by at least 75 % of the national bodies casting a vote.

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Amendment 2 to ISO/IEC 9541-2:1991 was prepared by Joint Technical Committee ISO/IEC JTC 1, *Information technology*, Subcommittee SC 34, *Document description and processing languages*.

This Amendment specifies additional properties to enhance functionality for font referencing (supporting PANOSE like referencing) in conjunction with additional definitions in ISO/IEC 9541-1/Amd.4.

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
